Underage Drinking

Traffic crashes are the leading cause of death for people 15 to 20 years old

Missouri Department of Transportation

Underage drinking cost the United States 68 billion dollars in 2007. This translates to a cost of 2,280 dollars per year, for each youth in the country.

In the last thirty days.... 51.6% Americans aged 12 and older have consumed alcohol at least once

Young people who begin drinking before age 15 are four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who begin drinking at age 21

Journal of Substance Abuse

In the last thirty days...
14.6% of kids age 12-17
consumed at least 1 drink

Drinking alcohol leads to a loss of coordination, poor judgment, slowed reflexes, distorted vision, memory lapses, and even blackouts

In the last thirty days...
8.8% of kids age 12-17
Binge drank
(5 or more drinks within 2 hours)

Drinking large amounts of alcohol can lead to coma or even death.

In the last thirty days... 2% of kids drank heavily (5 or more drinks on 5 or more occasions)

Alcohol can damage every organ in your body. It is absorbed directly into your bloodstream and can increase your risk for a variety of life-threatening diseases, including cancer.

In the last thirty days... 339,540 teens tried alcohol for the first time

Alcohol depresses your central nervous system, lowers your inhibitions, and impairs your judgment. Drinking can lead to risky behaviors, including having unprotected sex.

If you're around people who are drinking, you have an increased risk of being seriously injured, involved in car crashes, or affected by violence
