

Project REMOTE (2007-2010)

- Advent of MAT in the region
 - OTP opened in the region
 - Buprenorphine
- Access to funding
 - SAMHSA TCE Grant \$500,000 X 3 years (2007-2009)
 - General Funds \$267,000 (ongoing)
 - Civil Settlement with Purdue Pharma (\$306,414)

Project REMOTE – Key Features


Clinical

- Choice of medication (buprenorphine/naloxone; methadone; drug free)
- Active diversion mitigation
- Extensive case management
- Motivational Enhancement
 Therapy

- Education for health care providers
 - Opioid prescribing,
 - Use of the PMP
 - Community treatment services
- Community
 - Local health departments
 - Local health academics
 - Recovery community



Project REMOTE - Impact



Between 2006 and 2009 Project Remote contributed to the decline in drug/poison deaths in the communities where it was piloted.




National Governors Association Policy Conference

- 2012 -Virginia selected to participate in first NGA Prescription Drug Abuse Reduction Policy Academy
- Led by Department of Health Professions
 - DBHDS included on team
 - NGA focus on Education, Storage and Disposal,
 Data and Monitoring, Enforcement
 - Virginia's feedback resulted in increased NGA emphasis on the impact of treatment on reducing abuse, addiction and death

Handle with CARE


- Maternal substance use is highly correlated with infant mortality and founded CPS complaints of neglect.
- In SW Va, parental substance use is the leading cause of removing children from the home.
- Handle with CARE is statewide collaborative led by DBHDS to develop a work plan to reduce maternal SA.
- Includes SUD treatment providers, local physicians, local and state health departments, NICU nurses, Medical Society, health plans, Medicaid, local and state social services.
- DBHDS awarded In Depth TA from National Center for Substance Use and Child Welfare to develop an implementation plan.




Rural vs Urban
