Oxford Houses

- Friends of Recovery
- Oxford Houses
 - In 2002-only 21 Houses Statewide
 - Total number of opened in FY 2015-2016 9
 - Total in the state of 88
 - Total number of beds-717
 - Men's houses, women's houses, women with children houses, and men with children houses

Recovery Centers

Two Recovery Centers in Kansas

- Crossover Recovery Center in Wichita Funded by County Alcohol Tax Funds
- Pathfinder Recovery Center in Salina
 BG Funded

Both operate a drop in center where access to recovery supports is available without an appointment and free of charge.

SUD Peer Mentors

This service may operate during day/evening/weekend hours. The service promotes socialization, recovery, selfsufficiency, self-advocacy, development of and engagement in natural occurring support systems in the community and maintenance of community living.

SUD Peer Mentors, cont.

Peer mentors now being utilized in:

- Recovery Centers
- Oxford Houses
- Sobering Units
- Community Run Organizations (MH)
- SUD Treatment Centers
- State Hospitals (ICM)
- Reentry Programs

Behavioral Health Services

Integration State SUD Services and MH Services into Behavioral Health Services has helped include individuals with Co-Occurring SUD issues into housing opportunities across the state.



CABHI-Kansas Project

Cooperative Agreement to Benefit Homeless Individuals (CABHI) – Kansas Project

- ➤ In 2015, SAMHSA awarded the CABHI States grant to KDADS
- 3 year grant for a total of \$5,075,701
- Purpose of funding is to enhance the state's infrastructure to provide effective, comprehensive, coordinated treatment and permanent supportive housing to adults experiencing chronic homelessness who are diagnosed with a severe mental illness or a co-occurring severe mental illness and co-occurring substance use disorder

CABHI-Kansas Project

CABHI services

- Outreach and engagement
- Mental health services, including case management
- Substance use assessment, referral and treatment
- IPS supported employment services
- Assistance with accessing mainstream benefits

- Assistance with applying for SSI or SSDI following the SOAR model. Each site will have a full time SOAR case worker
- Peer support services
- Assistance with obtaining permanent supportive housing
