 - \$1.858 billion for the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant (SABG)
 - \$334 million for CSAT's discretionary portfolio





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
OTP SERVICE CONTINUITY PROJECT (SCP)






FIGURE S-1 Framework for developing standards for psychosocial interventions.




IMPROVING DATA: SPARS
