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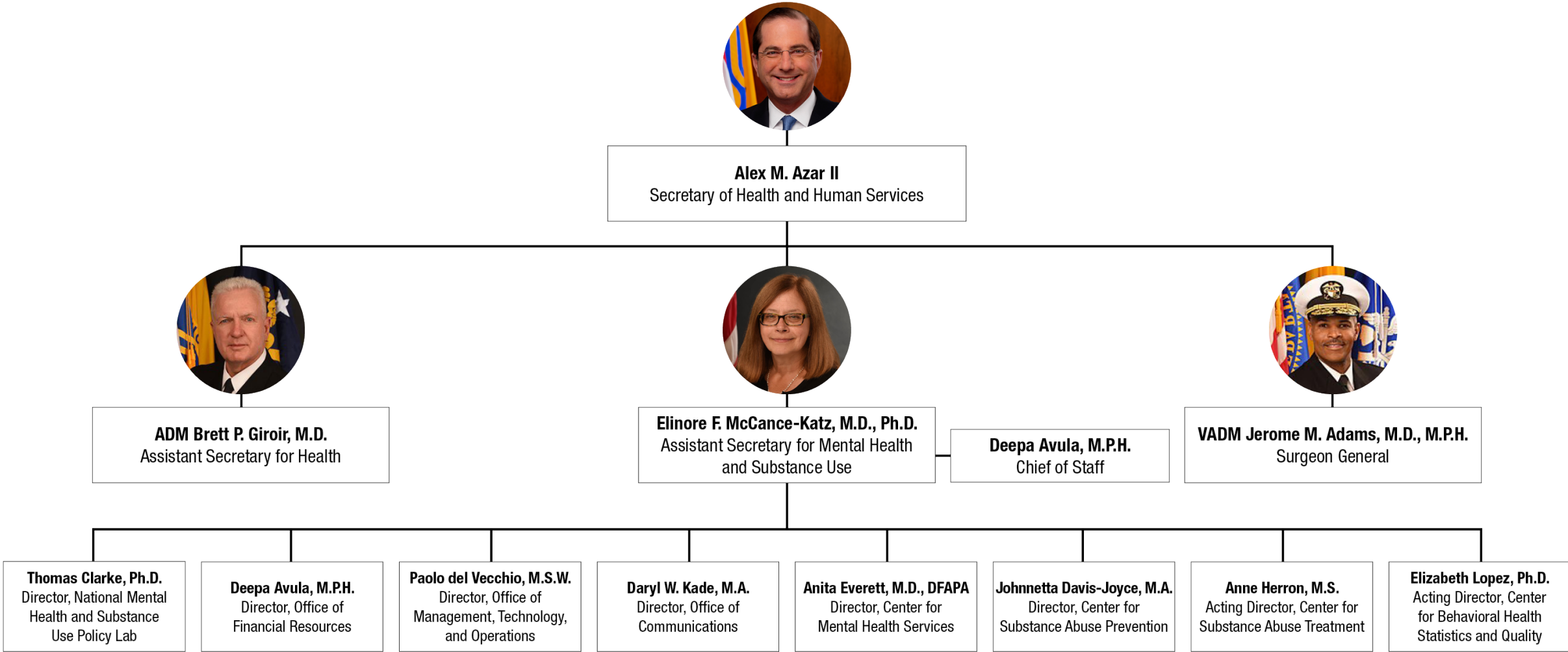

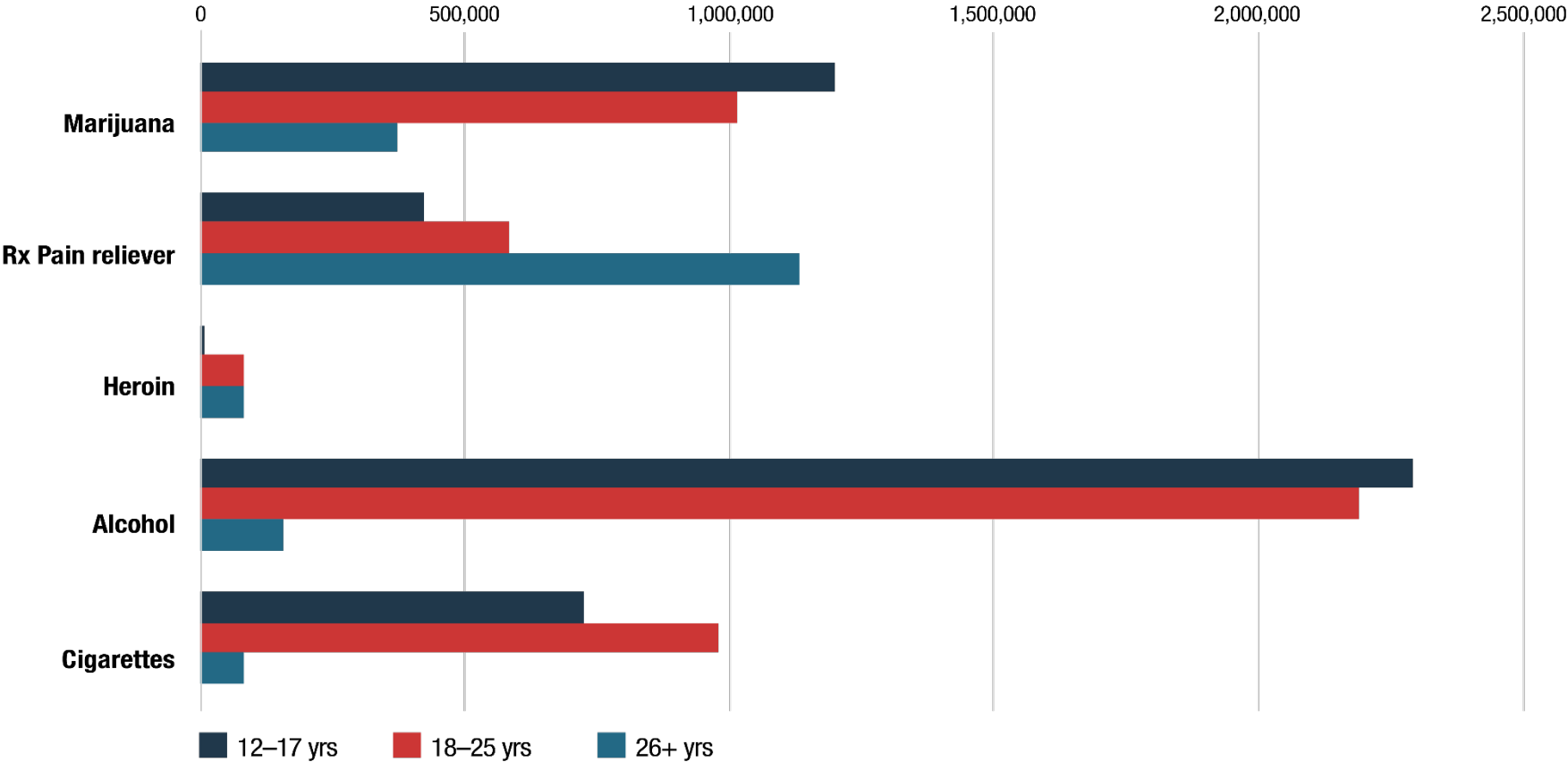

SAMHSA's Strategic Plan

- **Priority 1:** Combating the opioid crisis through the expansion of prevention, treatment, and recovery support services.
- **Priority 2:** Addressing serious mental illness and serious emotional disturbances.
- **Priority 3:** Advancing prevention, treatment, and recovery support services for substance use.
- **Priority 4:** Improving data collection, analysis, dissemination, and program and policy evaluation.
- **Priority 5:** Strengthen health practitioner training and education.

Past-Year Initiates of Substances by Age Group

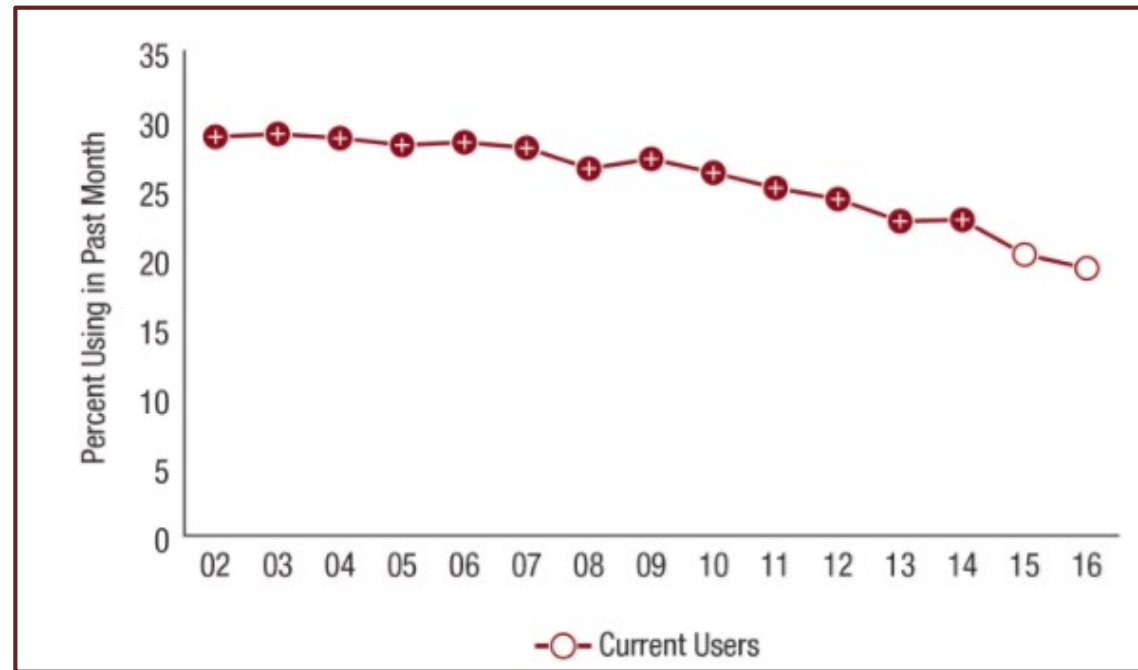

Current Alcohol Use among People Aged 12- to 20:

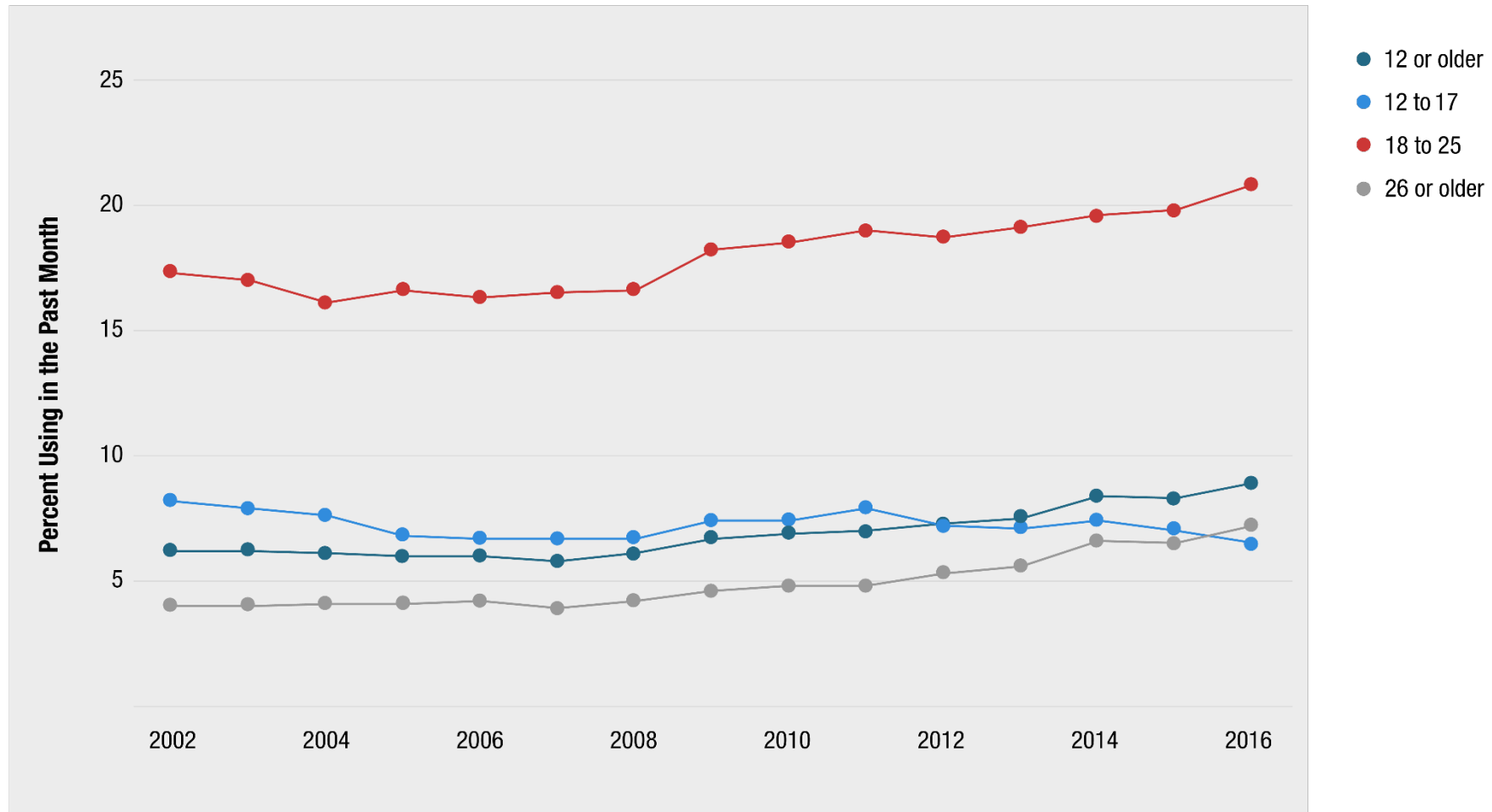
Percentages, 2002 - 2016

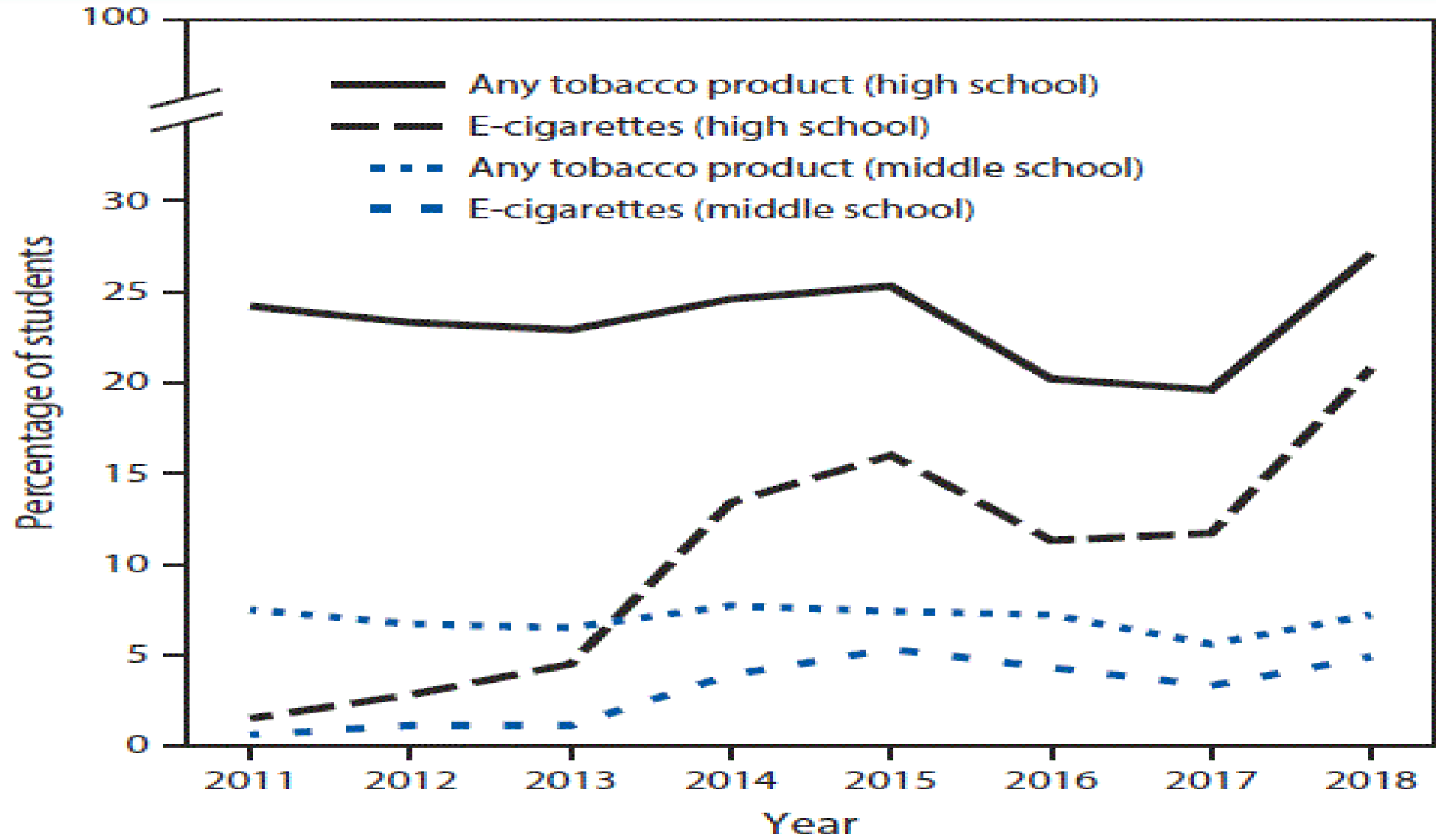
Marijuana Use on the Rise

Of Note: FY19 Prevention Budget Changes

- FY 2019 Enacted Amount of \$205.5M decreased by \$42.7M over FY 2018
- Funding for the following programs transferred to Substance Abuse Treatment:
 - First Responder Training (CARA) -*\$36M*
 - Grants to Prevent Prescription Drug/Opioid Overdose-Related Deaths - *\$12M*
 - Improved Access to Overdose Treatment -*\$1M*
- Funding for the following programs increased:
 - Minority Fellowship Program +250K Sober Truth Preventing Underage Drinking (STOP Act) +*\$1M*
 - Tribal Behavioral Health Grants +*\$5M*

Prevention Grant Programs - States



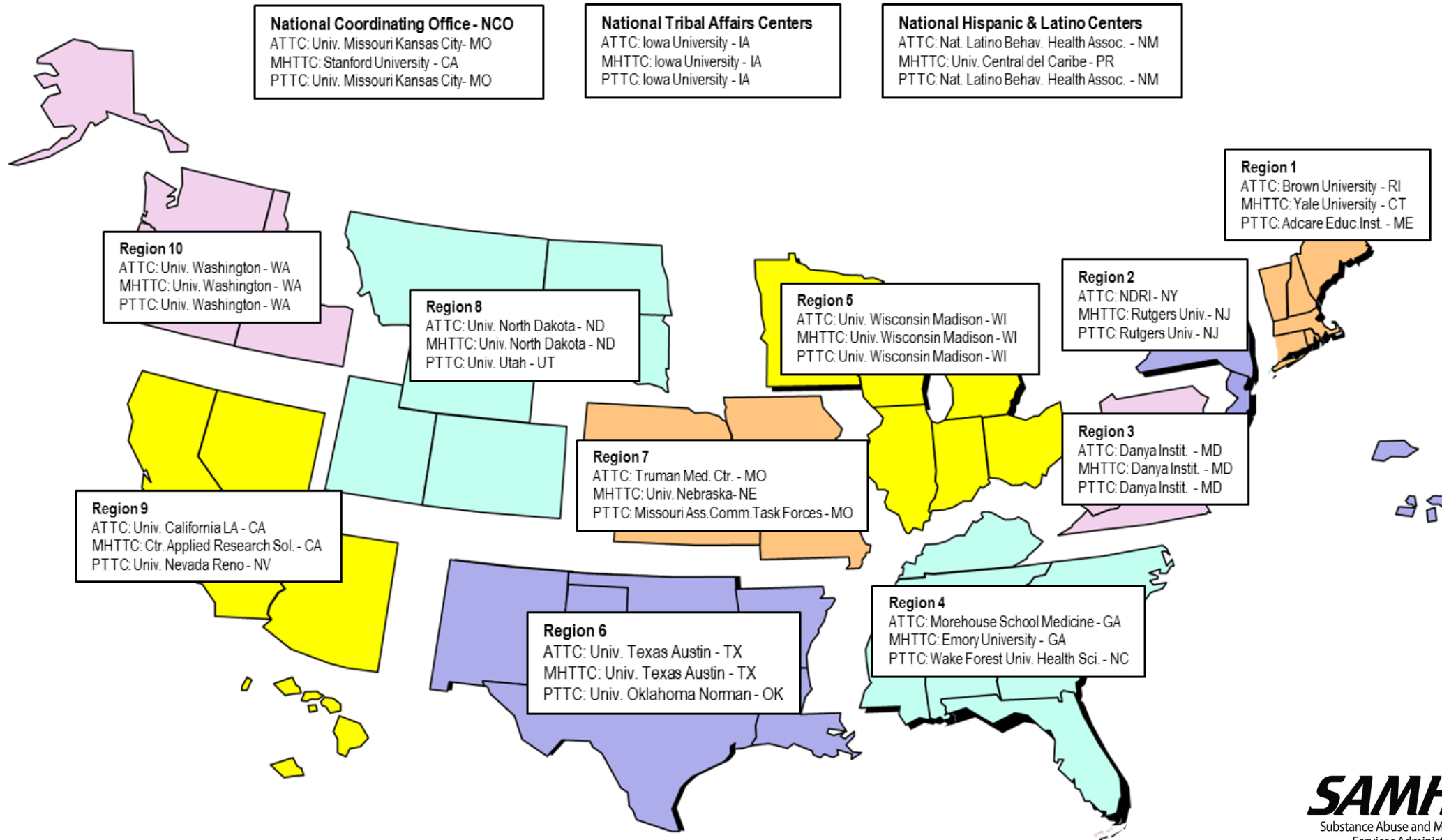
- Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant – **60 grants**
- Strategic Prevention Framework – Partnerships for Success (SPF-PFS) – **72 grants**
- First Responders – Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (FR-CARA) – **48 grants**
- Strategic Prevention Framework – Prescription Drugs (SPF-Rx) – **25 grants**
- Grants to Prevent Prescription Drug/Opioid Overdose-Related Deaths (PDO) – **12 grants**
- Improving Access to Treatment – **6 grants**
- Native Connections – **80 grants**

Prevention Grant Programs - Communities



- Drug-Free Communities (DFC): **724 grants**
- Drug-Free Communities Mentoring: **6 grants**
- Community-Based Coalition Enhancement Grants to Address Local Drug Crises (CARA Local Drug Crisis): **55 grants**
- Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act (STOP Act): **97 grants**
- Capacity Building for Substance Abuse and HIV Prevention for At-Risk Racial/Ethnic Minority Youth and Young Adults (HIV CBI): **122 grants**
- Prevention Navigator: **20 grants**
- Strategic Prevention Framework – Partnerships for Success 2019 (SPF-PFS): **Up to 127 grants**
